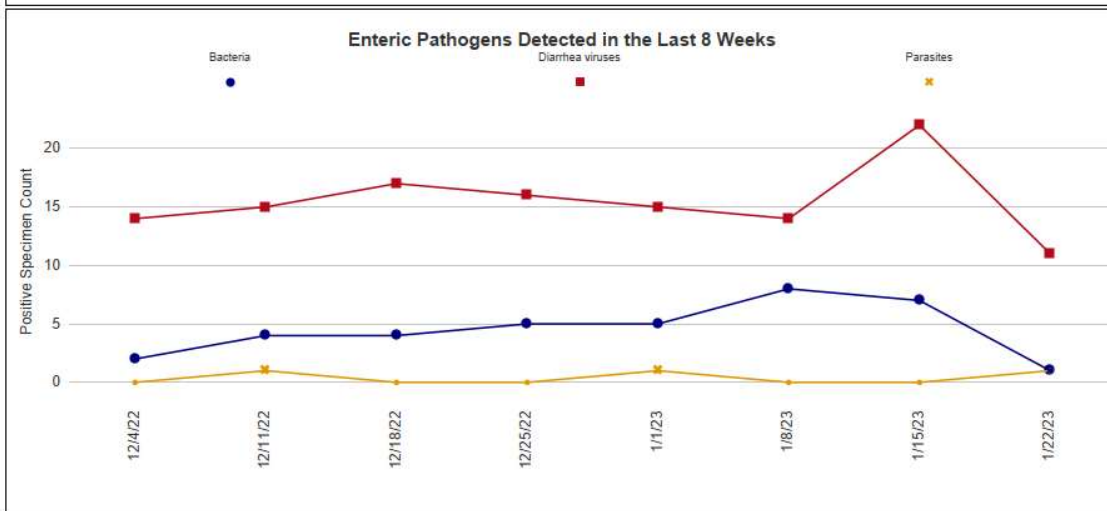
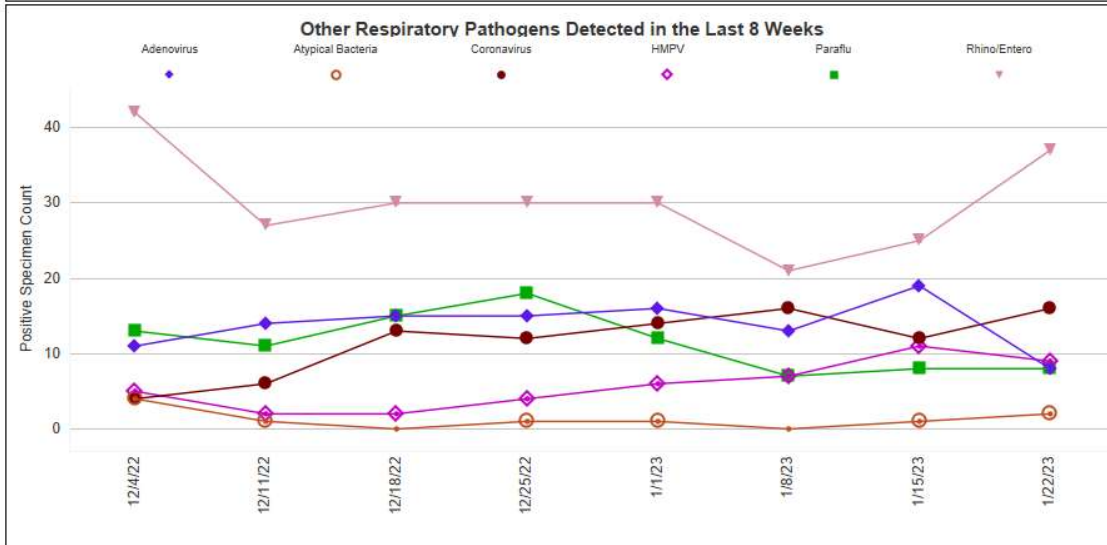
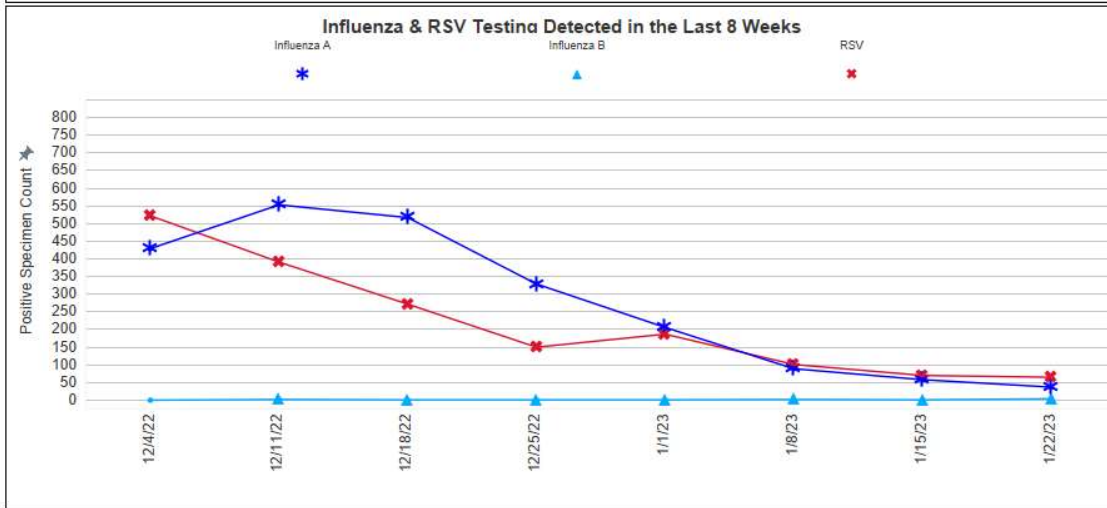
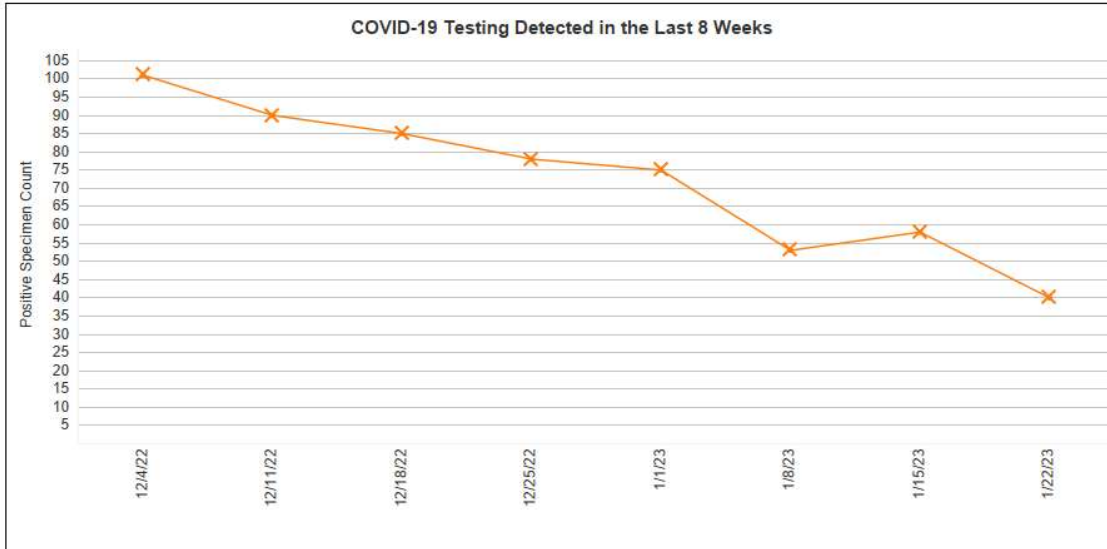


Bug Watch
