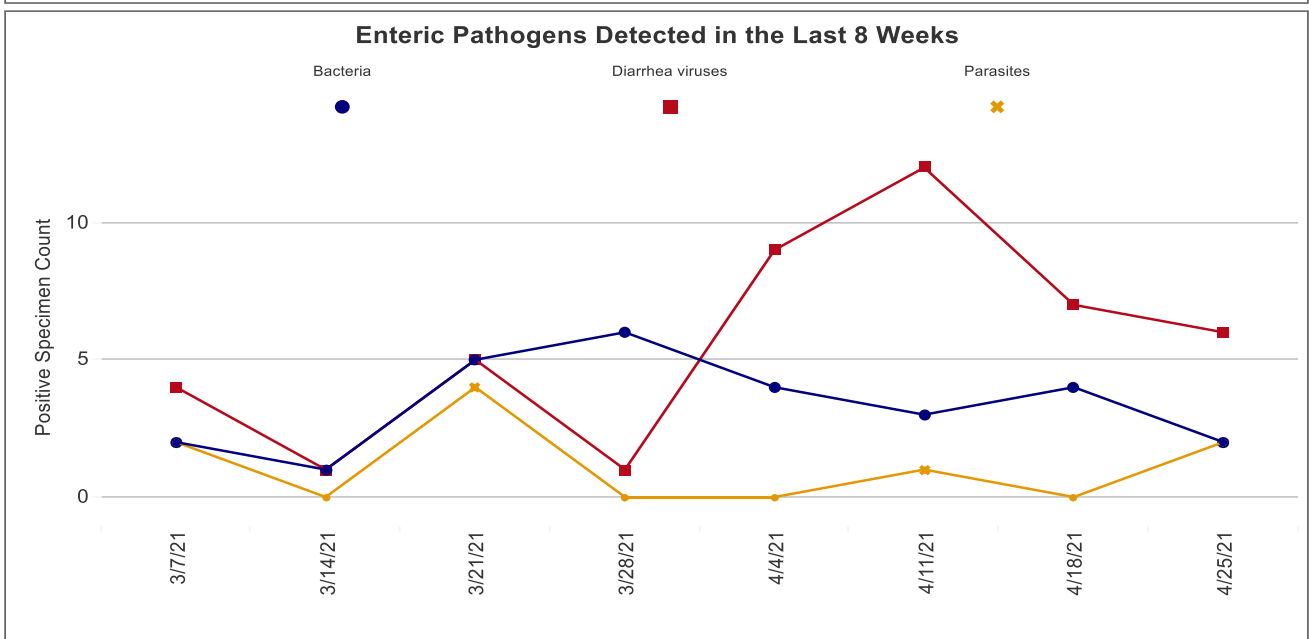
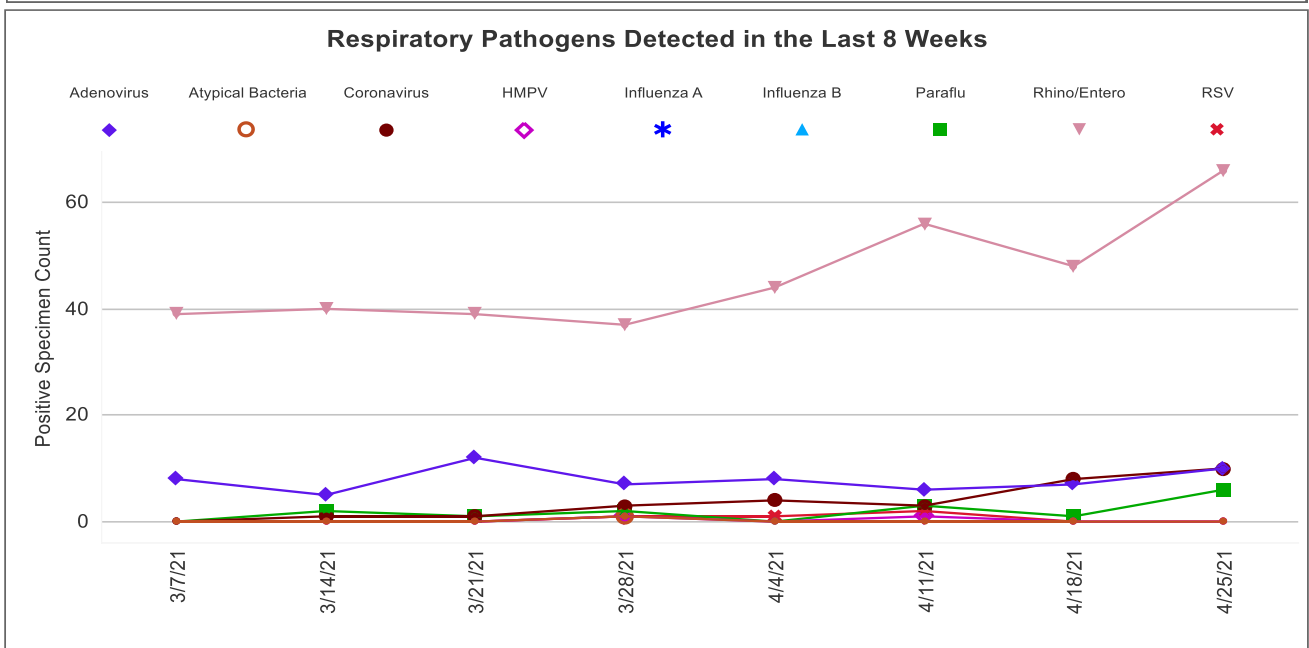
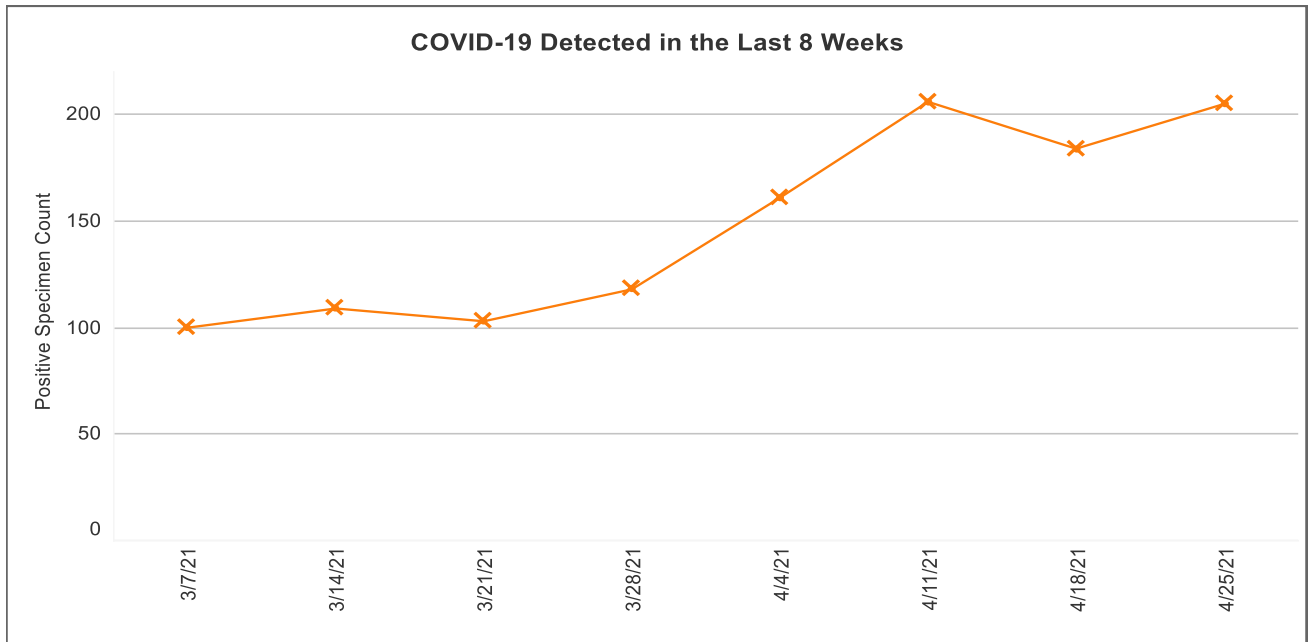


Bug Watch

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Late Breaker: As a reminder that the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic is not over and that vaccines for children under 16 are still unavailable, we have seen an increase in positive SARS-CoV-2 children over the past 2 weeks. As a reminder, Children’s Hospital Colorado is open to vaccination to anyone in the community 16 years of age or older (for information visit: www.Childrenscolorado.Org/Getvaccinated). Complicating the landscape, we have also started to see a resurgence of some of the “normal” seasonal respiratory viruses including parainfluenza viruses and seasonal coronaviruses in addition to the ever-present adenoviruses and rhinoviruses. Thankfully, we have not yet seen a resurgence of RSV or influenza. Furthermore, we have also seen an increase in gastrointestinal disease due to norovirus.



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
