Objectives:

1. Provide evidence-based medical nutrition therapy to patients in all phases of solid organ transplantation (pre, peri-op and post) in compliance with CMS guidelines and UCH Department of Nutrition policy.
2. Participate in the multidisciplinary evaluation of solid organ transplant candidates.
3. Provide nutrition education to patients and families with specific regard to symptoms and complications of end stage organ disease.

Rotation Checklist:

At the successful completion of this rotation, the intern will be able to:

Apply evidence-based guidelines, systematic reviews and scientific literature (such as the Academy's Evidence Analysis Library and Evidence-based Nutrition Practice Guidelines, the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, National Guideline Clearinghouse Web sites) in the nutrition care process and model and other areas of dietetics practice.
