#### Objectives:

1. Intern will work effectively in a multidisciplinary team setting to develop nutrition diagnosis, intervention, and care plan for complex GI/Liver patients.
2. Intern will be able to identify macro/micronutrient absorption in the GI tract and be able to make nutrition support modifications based on the patient's diagnosis.
3. Intern will be able to use current research in GI nutrition to suggest appropriate nutrition interventions for Pediatric GI patients.
