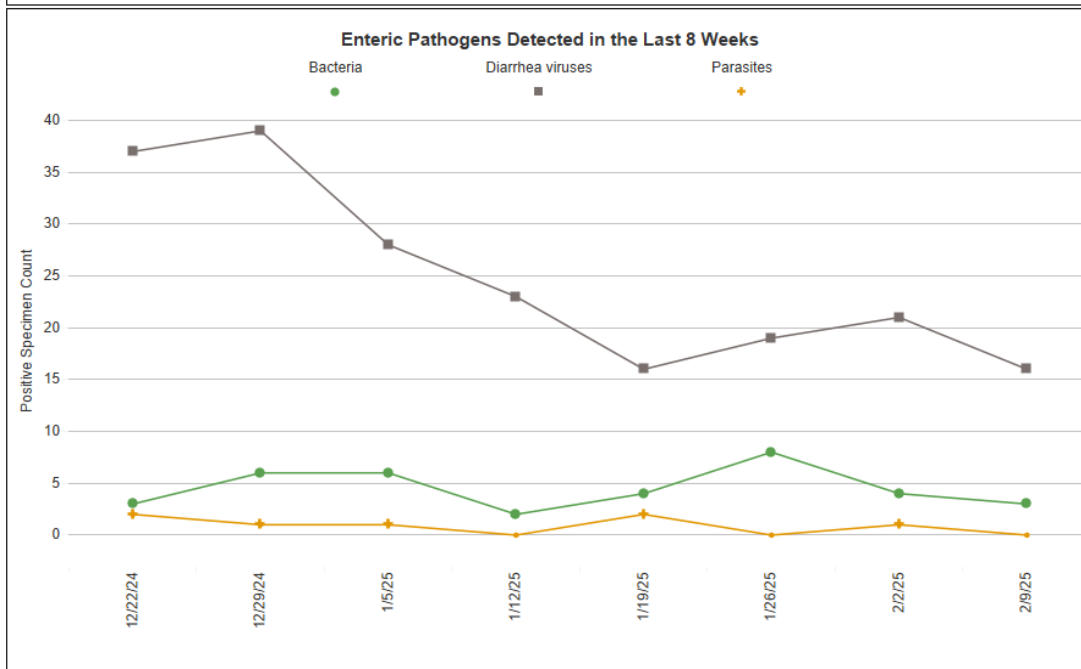
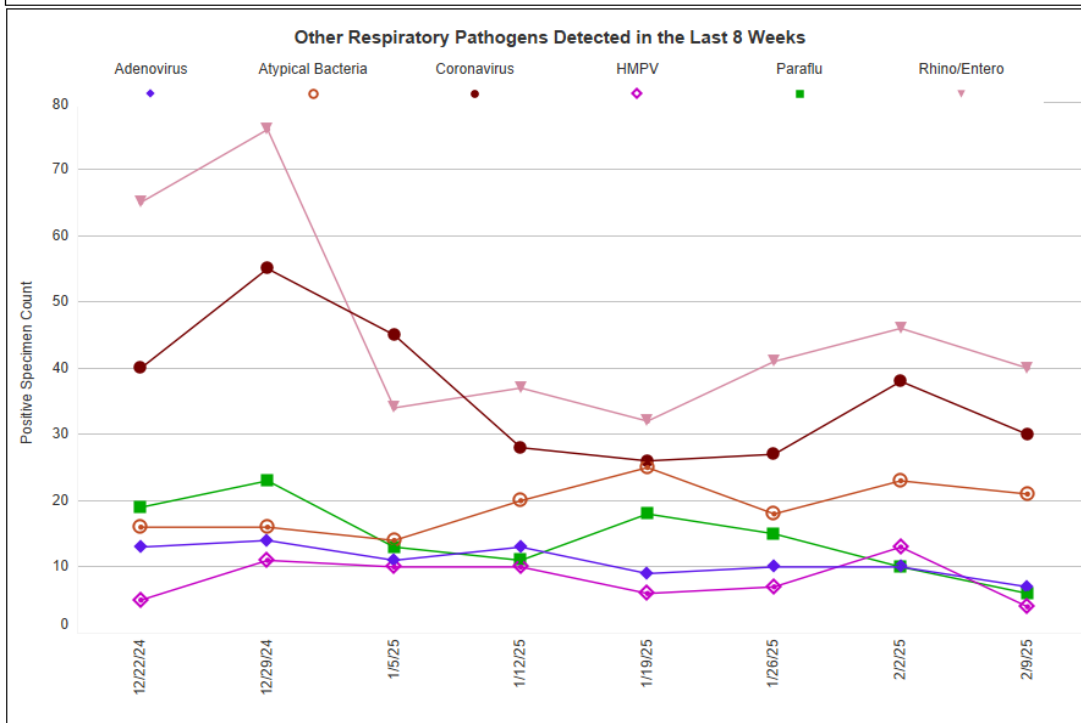
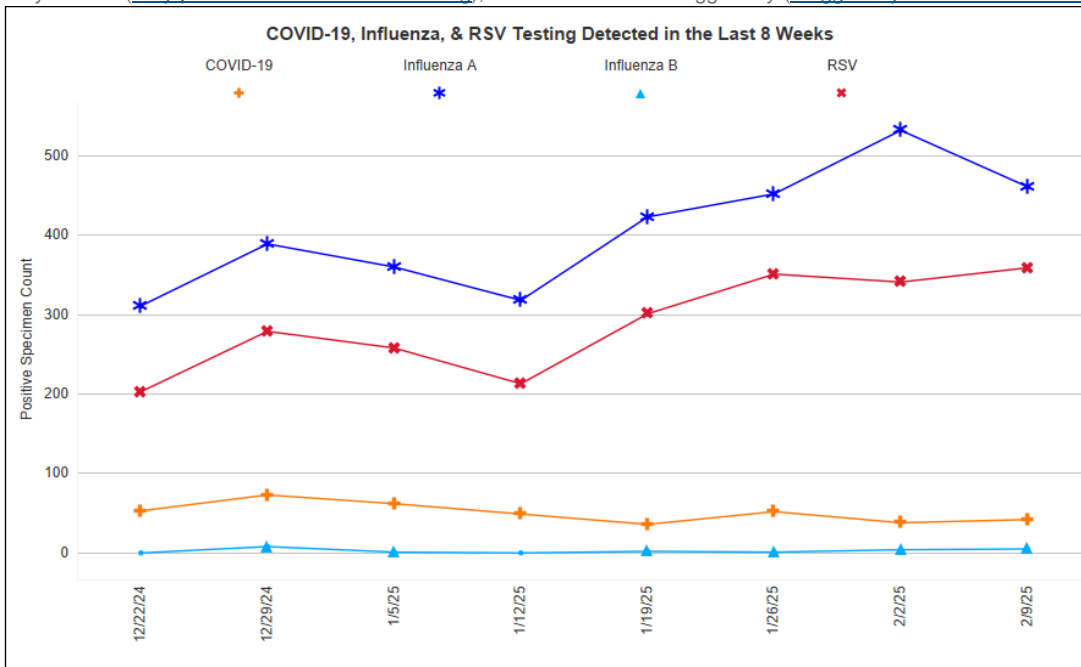

**Late Breaker:** As of 2/11/25, the current measles outbreak in Gaines County, Texas continues to expand with 24 confirmed cases (22 in children < 18 yo) with 9 hospitalizations. All cases have occurred in unvaccinated individuals and numbers are likely to increase as vaccination rates for MMR in some of the public schools in this county are low. Consider measles on your differential diagnosis in children presenting with a fever and rash (especially with a history of recent travel to Texas) and encourage everyone to be up-to-date on their measles vaccination.
