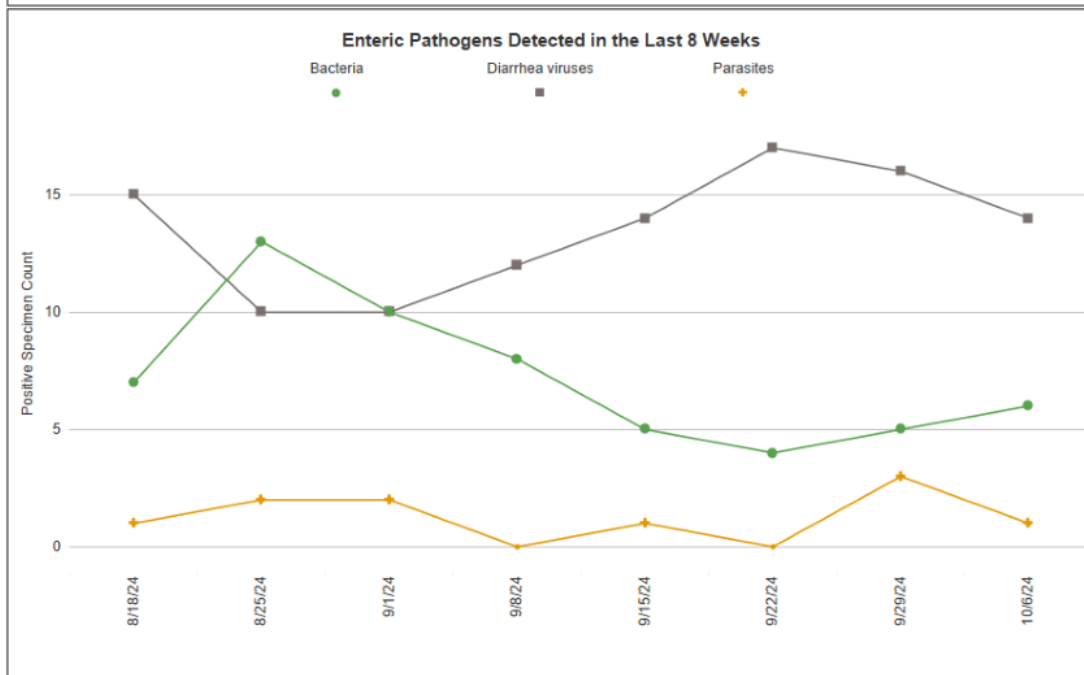
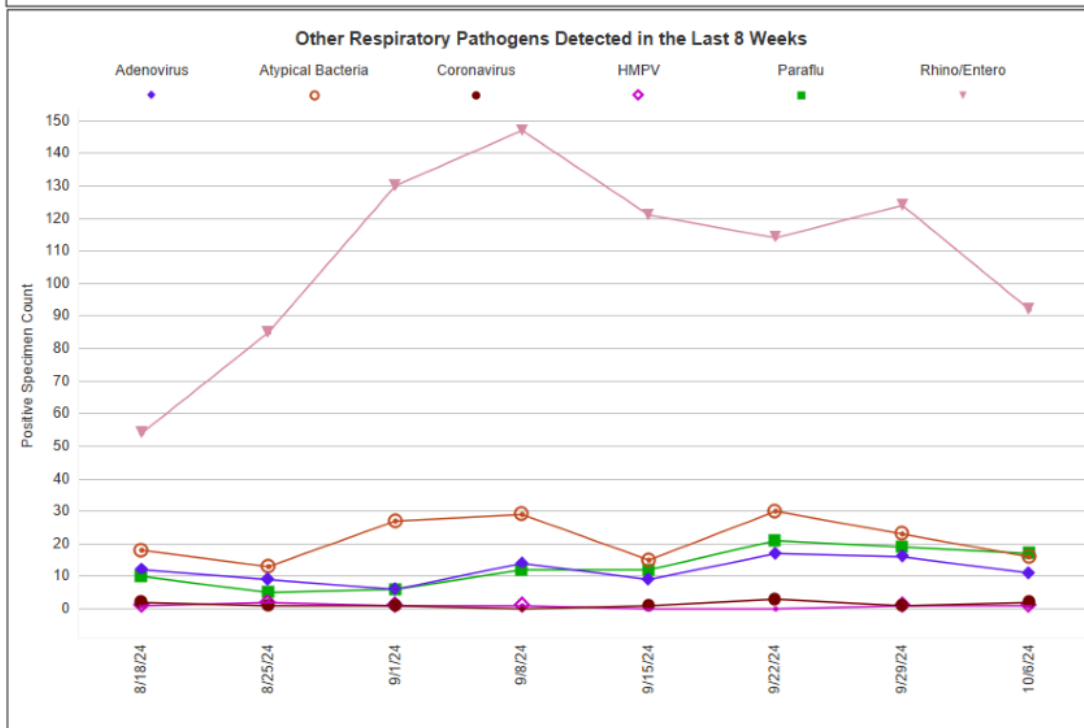
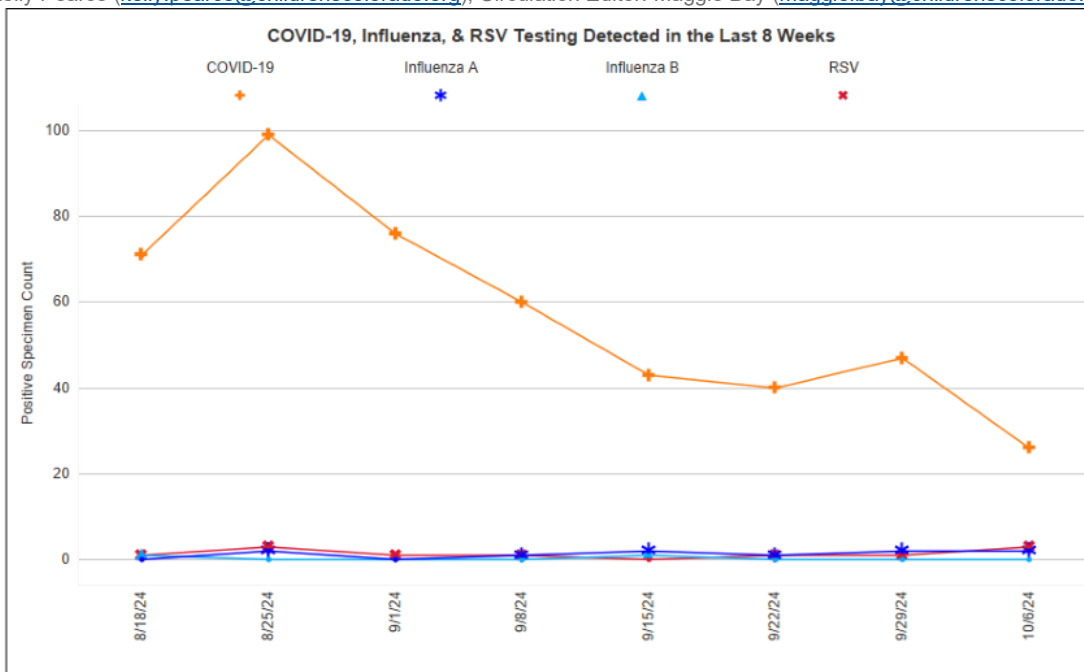

Late Breaker: Preliminary data from the CDC suggest that pertussis cases have returned to pre-pandemic levels with more than five times as many cases reported through the end of September compared to the same time in 2023 and higher than what was seen during the same time in 2019. This serves as a good reminder to ensure everyone is up-to-date on their pertussis vaccination and to test those presenting with compatible symptoms to inform treatment and prophylaxis.
